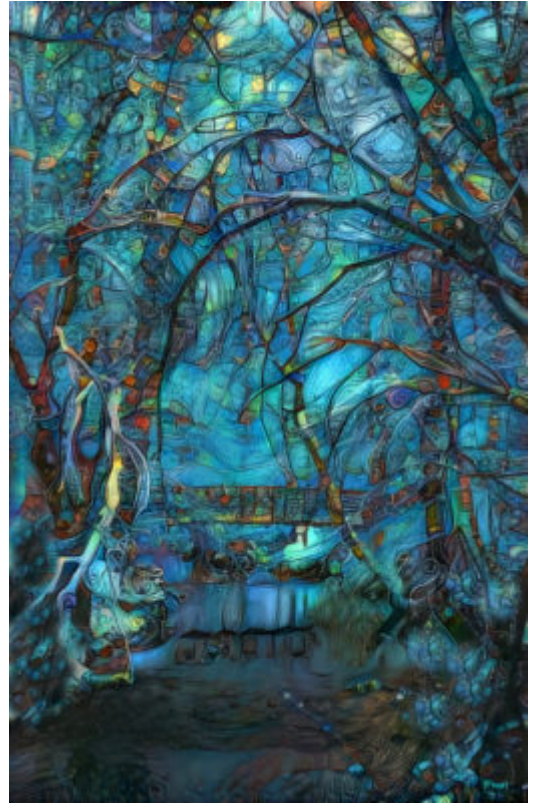


2020 Advent Lectionary: Waiting for Revelation
