
# 2024 Advent Liturgy: Hoping for What We Don't See

Leader 2: We give thanks for your Holy Church, where we plant our future, acting with hope by loving our enemies, planting trees, and raising our children.

All: With grateful hearts, filled with hope, we await the coming of the One who is already here.

BLESSING THE ELEMENTS

Leader 1: Christ invites everyone to eat the bread of life, to drink the cup of the new covenant.

Leader 2: Jesus said, I am the bread of life.

You who come to me shall never hunger;

you who believe in me shall never thirst.

Leader 1: On the night he gave himself up, Jesus took bread,

and after giving thanks to God, broke it and said,

This is my body,

broken for the healing of the world.

Whenever you eat it, do so remembering me.

Leader 2: After supper, Jesus took the cup and said,

This is the cup of the new covenant,

poured out for you and for all.

Whenever you drink it, do so remembering me.

All: 0 Holy One, send down your Spirit

that these gifts of grain and grape,

and work of human hands

may be for us the body and blood of Christ.
