SILENT REFLECTION

Leader 1: On the night of his arrest, Jesus took bread, and after giving thanks to God, broke it and said, "This is my body which is for you; do this remembering me."

Leader 2: After supper, Jesus took the cup and said, "This is the cup of the new covenant; whenever you drink it, do this remembering me."
